



## The Implementation of Citizen Judges System Commemorative Souvenir Sheet

The Citizen Judges System formally goes into effect on January 1, 2023, putting citizen and professional judges on the same trial panels for the first time in the nation's history. The change carried deep historical significance. To commemorate this event, Chungwa Post has specially released a souvenir sheet with one stamp of a face value of NT\$28.

The stamp features a court with citizen judges, and the marginal inscription of the souvenir sheet features the Judicial Office Building in Taipei, which is a national heritage site. Under this new system, judicial panels responsible for reaching verdicts for major criminal cases will consist of six citizen judges and three professional judges. Citizens who are at least 23 years of age will be eligible to serve. Through their active participation and diverse perspectives, the citizens on these panels will bring the judiciary closer in line with popular thinking and raise transparency, increasing understanding of the judiciary and faith in its reliability.

## 100<sup>th</sup> Birthday of Former President Lee Teng-hui Commemorative Souvenir Sheet

Former President Lee Teng-hui was born on January 15, 1923 and passed away on July 30, 2020. His 100<sup>th</sup> birthday falls on January 15, 2023. To express gratitude for the first popularly elected president in the nation's history, Chunghwa Post has released a souvenir sheet in commemoration. Featuring a stamp with a denomination of NT\$28, it has a simple and stately appearance: A block of gold represents the solid and precious stone that President Lee laid for the foundations of democratic society in Taiwan and the deep values of freedom that he embodied.

Lee served as a minister without portfolio in the Executive Yuan, mayor of Taipei, vice president of the Republic of China during its seventh term, and the ROC president during its seventh, eighth and ninth terms. He initiated many democratic reforms during his presidency, putting Taiwan on the path to becoming a stable constitutional democracy.
