

The Championship of the WBSC Premier12 2024 Commemorative Issue

Taiwan's national baseball team won the championship at the WBSC Premier12 2024, marking the first time Taiwan claimed the title in this prestigious tournament. This historic and inspiring achievement has opened a new chapter in the history of baseball in Taiwan. In celebration and in recognition of the players' outstanding performances, Chunghwa Post has released a four-stamp se-tenant strip.

The stamps feature the following themes: "Taiwan's Heroes and the Premier12 Trophy," "The Ace Pitchers," "The Champions and the MVP Captain," and "The Golden Coaching Staff." Each stamp displays the WBSC Premier12 logo. Additionally, in keeping with the theme of Premier12, each stamp is denominated at NT\$12.

Personal greeting stamps without marginal inscriptions have been released along with the stamps, which feature a full set of "The Championship of the WBSC Premier12 2024 Commemorative Issue." These customizable stamps are suited to collect.

Centennial Anniversary of Dr. Sun Yat-sen's Death Commemorative Souvenir Sheet

In 2025, it has been 100 years since Dr. Sun Yat-sen passed away. In commemoration and as a gesture of respect and remembrance, Chunghwa Post has released a souvenir sheet containing two stamps with denominations of NT\$12 and NT\$35. Dr. Sun Yat-sen, who is the founding father of the Republic of China, and the National Dr. Sun Yat-



sen Memorial Hall in Taipei are the main design elements of the stamps. To symbolize the idea of "flourishing prosperity," the sheet features bold lines and vibrant colors depicting abundant fruits, lotus flowers, a pair of Taiwan Blue Magpies and Formosan Black Bears. Descriptions of the stamps follow:

- 1. NT\$12 stamp: National Dr. Sun Yat-sen Memorial Hall, which is located in Taipei's Xinyi district, was established to commemorate the national founding father and to promote his thoughts and teachings. Architect Wang Da-hung designed the building in a modern style but with flying eaves inspired by Tang dynasty architecture. The building contains an internationally renowned performance hall and frequently hosts academic, artistic, and cultural events. It is one of the most versatile venues for art and culture in the nation.
- 2. NT\$35 stamp: Dr. Sun Yat-sen, the founding father of the Republic of China, was originally named Sun Wen. His courtesy name was Zaizhi and his sobriquetwas Yat-sen, and he was also known as Zhongshan during the revolutionary period. As a youth, he enrolled in the College of Medicine for Chinese in Hong Kong and began advocating for revolution. After 10 failed uprisings, the 1911 Revolution finally succeeded in overthrowing the Qing dynasty and in establishing the first democratic republic in Asia. He authored the Three Principles of the People and the Five-Power Constitution as the blueprint for nation-building, thus making significant contributions to the country and its people. He passed away on March 12, 1925, and in 1940 the ROC National Government officially honored him as the "Founding Father of the Republic of China."
